6. SERVICE LEARNING TRIPS

- a. The service learning trip to Yanbei was cancelled owing to the closure of the partner school in the region. Yet, \$1,747.8 was still spent in buying daily necessities for low-income families that the participants of the learning trip to Sichuan (31/3- 4/4/2015) were going to visit.
- b. 16 students S4 & S5 joined the aforementioned trip in which they visited privately-run schools in poor ethnic minority areas in Southwest Sichuan as well as low-income families affected by the 512 earthquake. They realized how hard life had been for these people. The grant acquired was spent in subsidizing the participation of students.

Tour fees: \$1,100 X 16 students = \$17,600

Travel Insurance for the whole group= \$2,350

Total spending: \$19,950

7. COMMUNITY SERVICES

- a. The Fun Fair was held in October 2014 to promote the activities of Community Services Student Team to the whole school.

Subsidies used for decorating display board: \$119.1

- b. From December 2014 to March 2015, some integration activities among our students and South Asian children were arranged. A few gatherings were held which included ice-breathing games at the community centre and an outing activity. Such activity was co-organized with the Salvation Army Chai Wan Integrated Service For Young People.

Subsidy used for buying materials for the games during the visit and orienteering: \$800.9

- c. 15 S3 - S5 students participated in a visit to the centre of the Heep Hong Society, Wan Chui Centre and completed an integration activity with some children with intellectual disabilities on 11 April 2015.

Subsidy used for buying materials for the activity: \$383.7

8. CCSC SAGE ELDER ACADEMY

Some students will participate in a visit to the Hong Kong Society for the Aged Eastern District Elderly Community Centre, carrying out an integration activity for the elderly on the 15 and 22 August 2015.

The subsidies of about \$600 will be used to buy materials for the activity.

9. RED CROSS YOUTH TEAM

The Red Cross Youth Team of our School participated in various competitions organized by the Hong Kong Red Cross and made heartening attainments.

\$1069.5 was used for the related registration fee of the above competitions and the rest of the subsidy was spent on the enrolment ceremony held on 18 Jul 2015.

10. HISTORY ROLE PLAY COMPETITION

Subsidies used for costumes and prizes = \$3684.8

11. STAR OF CCSC AWARD

3 Awardees for 2013/14: prizes were presented on the Speech Day of 2014-15 to Lai Pui Yi (S2), Li Tsz Yau Dorothy (S3) and Tam Amy Yeng Sen (S3) as a recognition of their effort in representing Hong Kong in international competitions.

Subsidy used for prizes: \$1500

12. ECA PARTICIPATION FOR DISADVANTAGED STUDENTS

All the subsidy was spent on subsidizing five students who are CSSA or under full grant of STSA (Tour charge: \$ 25,081.8) joining the tour to Australia from 4/7 to 15/7/2015.

Subsidy for each participant: \$10,000

Total subsidy = 5 x \$10,000 = \$50,000

13. PROMOTION OF ENGLISH SPEAKING

1400 files were produced with the use of students' designs to promote English speaking outside the classroom. They were distributed to all students of the academic year 2014-2015 and new S1 students of the coming one.

Subsidies used for producing the files = \$4,900

14. ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNING PROJECTS

a. Outstanding English Ambassador Award (Expenditure: \$1,840)

As commented by the teacher in charge of the English Ambassadors, all members this year had provided strong support to the School in running different activities to promote the English-speaking atmosphere. All members (43 students) were presented with the awards - the English book coupons for the English Book Fair in May 2015. The value ranged from \$40 to \$60, subject to the commitment and contribution of students as observed by the English teachers concerned.

b. English Language Learning Project (Expenditure: \$1,450)

33 S4 and S5 students were nominated for the Star Awards by the English Ambassadors/ English teachers for their regular English speaking habits both during class time and after lessons. While the awards may encourage students to develop a good habit of using English on school campus, the teachers pointed out that it was difficult to nominate students with reference to their habit after class.

15. PURCHASE OF BOOKS OF GREAT FILMS

A number of books were procured, including *Four: A Divergent Collection*, *Maze Runner*, *Trash (MTI)*, *Travelling to Infinity* and *the Boy in the Striped Pajamas* and *Mortal Instruments*, and \$975.55 had been spent.

16. CHINESE AWARD SCHEME

The Best Classroom Performance Award was given to each class in both school terms while the Most Improved Student Award was offered to every class in the Second Term. The value of book coupons for the winners ranged from \$30 to \$40 and the total expenditure was \$2,350. The prizes were greatly conducive to encouraging students to be attentive in class and be inquisitive besides trying to improve their academic results.

17. CHINESE INTEREST CLASS

Subsidizing 9 S1 to S3 students CSSA/full fee remission students in joining the class: \$3,600

18. LUNAR NEW YEAR FAIR STALL

a. The Lunar New Year Fair Stall of our School was set up at the Victoria Park and managed by 61 S5 BAFS students. The total amount of investment for the project was around \$124,542.8 this year and the Alumni Foundation Fund contributed \$35,242.8, which greatly facilitated the running of the activity. Finally, a profit of \$51,753 was recorded and \$14,644.9 was allotted to the Fund accordingly.

b. \$3,023 was spent on purchasing 2 aluminum ladders and 1 electric pump supporting the operation of the Lunar New Year Fair Stall.
