Implementation

Environmentally Friendly School Campus

- Work with students to use resources and equipment efficiently
- Enforce the switching off of lights, fans and air-conditioners when they are not in use
- Use an electronic-notice system to communicate with parents on school and student matters
- ullet Forbid the use of air-conditioners in the classroom if the temperature is below 26 $^{\circ}\mathrm{C}$
- Support the Earth Hour organized by the World Wildlife Funds (WWF) and pledge to safeguard the future of the Earth by treasuring natural resources
- Use double-side printing

Learning Activities

- Organize talks and performances in assemblies to promote the ideas of environmental protection
- Have an agriculture garden and a freshwater fish pond, both run by teachers with the assistance of students, to help students appreciate the natural environment and the idea of sustainability
- The Geography and Conservancy Society organizing various types of activities to promote education on environmental protection

Low Carbon Lifestyle of Students

- Encourage the use of durable water containers, lunch boxes and utensils
- Have recycling box for paper in every classroom and staff room, and recycling bins for paper, aluminium cans and plastic bottles in the canteen and school office
