1. In about 3500 B.C., there were two kingdoms: Upper Egypt (in the south) and Lower Egypt (in the north).↵
2. Around 3150 B.C., King Narmer (Menes) of Upper Egypt united them.↵
3. He was called a pharaoh. The Egyptians thought that a pharaoh was a god from heaven.↵
4. A pharaoh set up a government with many officials and scribes to help him rule the country.↵
5. Commoners included farmers, craftsmen and merchants. But slaves were at the social bottom in Egypt.↵

Farming and trade↵

1. The Egyptians farmers not only dug canals and ditches but also used a simple machine called shaduf to bring water to their fields. So they could grow many crops such as wheat, barley and fruits.↵
2. The craftsmen made beautiful golden objects and jewellery.↵
3. Merchants sailed along the coasts of the Red Sea and the Mediterranean Sea to trade with other people.↵

The Greeks held festivals to honour their gods and goddesses. The most important one was the Olympic Games held every four years in Olympia in the honour of the ruler of all gods and goddesses --- Zeus. Athletes took part in many events. During the games, all the city-states stopped fighting so that the athletes could travel safely. The winners of the games were given a crown of olive leaves as prizes. They were famous for the rest of their lives. The sport events only allowed men to join. Men athletes did not wear clothes. The Greeks thought that only uncivilized people were ashamed of their bodies. All these games continued until the Romans stopped them in 394 A.D.↵

B. International crises before the outbreak of WWI

- There were two crises over ^{Africa} Morocco between ^{(Austria) ← 奥地利 → (Britain)} Germany and France, strengthening their respective alliances and worsening international relations. (Morocco Crisis) ①
- Besides, ^{the Balkans} became the powder keg of Europe — Austria and Serbia conflicted in the ^(Bosnian) Bosnian Crisis (1908) whereas there were 2 Balkan Wars (1912-13) fought between the Balkan states and the Ottoman Empire. These further added oil to the heated atmosphere.

C. Immediate cause: the Assassination at Sarajevo (1914)

- On 28 June 1914, Archduke ^(Aust) Francis Ferdinand of Austria-Hungary and his wife were assassinated by a ^(Serb) Serb sent by the ^(Austria-Hungary) Black Hand (a secret anti-Austrian society).
- Austria-Hungary, after gaining a ^(blank cheque) blank cheque (unconditional support) from Germany, offered Serbia a very harsh ultimatum. ^{Aus, Ger v.s. Serbia, Russia}
- Though Serbia accepted all terms except the last one, Austria still declared war on her. The other powers joined the war because of various reasons. Hence a local conflict developed into the First World War.

→ Course (P.28-29)

1. 1914

- Germany carried out the ^(Schlieffen) Schlieffen Plan, which was designed to avoid a two-front war. Hence Germany invaded France through ^(Belgium) Belgium so as to defeat France within 6 weeks and then turn east to attack Russia.
- Yet, the German invasion brought the entry of Britain into the war for her own safety.
- With the failure of the Schlieffen Plan, both sides dug trenches and the war reached a deadlock.

2. 1915

- Italy joined the Allies as it was promised some territories.

3. 1917

- To prevent food and raw materials from reaching Britain, Germany adopted the ^(unrestricted) unrestricted submarine warfare → block boats go to Britain.
- Apart from the sinking of Lusitania, the USA decided to enter the war as she discovered through the Zimmermann telegram the German plan to ally with Mexico.
- The ^(October) October Revolution broke out in Russia and the communist government withdrew the nation from the war in November.
